SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

All races will be governed by the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2 ENTRIES

- All entries (\$10 skipper \$5 crew capped at \$25.00) shall be on the official entry envelope and be lodged at the registration desk of the Wynyard Yacht Club by 1300 hours on the day of racing.
- Boats and their equipment, including their safety equipment, may be checked at any time during the event by the Principal Race Officer or his delegate.
- All skippers must be a member of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing Crew who are not a member of a club will need to sign the WYC indemnity form available at registration desk.
- Racing will be in three divisions. Trailer sailer division, Dingy division, Catamaran division.
- A minimum of four entries will constitute a division.

3 BRIEFING

A briefing will be held at the Wynyard Yacht Club and Old Port boat ramp at 1230 hours 30 Jan 2021

4 CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board not less than 60 minutes prior to the race.

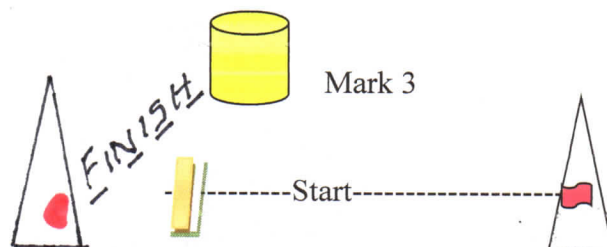
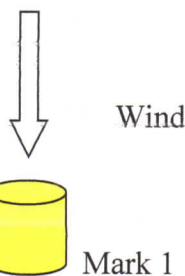
5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- Signals made ashore will be displayed on the Wynyard Yacht Club flagpole.
- Flag AP with two sound signal means "The race is postponed". The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after AP is lowered.

6 COURSE

6.1 The Principal Race Officer will set a course with a length suitable for completion in a time frame of approximately 60 minutes

6.2 The course will be all triangles leaving marks to Port. Mark 3 will be placed after starting.



Yachts with a yardstick of 100 or less will sail 5 laps.
Yachts with a yardstick of 127 or less will sail 3 laps.
Yachts with a yardstick of greater than 127 will sail 2 laps.

8 MARKS

Mark 1, 2, 3, will be yellow cylindrical buoys with a black band.

9 SIGN ON, SIGN OFF

9.1 Each yacht skipper shall personally sign on before the start of each race and sign off within one hour of the finish of the last boat in their class.

9.2 Sign on and sign off sheets will be placed at the registration desk

10 THE START

10.1 The race will be started with all divisions starting together.

10.2 The race shall be started using the following signals from the Committee boat. Times shall be taken from the visual signal; A sound signal will also be used at each step of the start sequence.

10.3 Boats on the course side of the starting line at the start will be notified by raising code flag X

Once these boats have returned the flag will be lowered. Boats failing to return through the line after a premature start will be disqualified.

10.4 Start Sequence

• FIVE minutes prior to the start – Code flag R raised



• Four minutes prior to start – Code Flag P Raised

• One Minute prior to start – Code Flag P Lowered

• Go – Code flag R Lowered



10.3 The starting line will be between the mast on the Committee boat and the yellow cylindrical buoy that will be removed after starting.

10.6 A boat shall not start later than 10 minutes after the starting signal.

11 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between Committee boat and mark 3

12 TIME LIMIT

The time limit will be 120 minutes.

13 PROTESTS

13.1 Protests shall be written on forms available at the club-house accompanied by a fee of \$100.00, and delivered there within 60 minutes after the time of the last boat to finish the respective race.

13.2 Protests will be heard in approximately the order of receipt as soon as possible. Protest notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors where and when there is a hearing in which they are parties to a protest or named as witnesses.

14 DECISION TO RACE

The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.

15 PRIZES

15.1 Prizes will be issued as soon as possible after the completion of the results.

15.2 The perpetual shield will be awarded to placegetters for 1st overall on Victorian yardstick for all classes combined.

15.3 Prizes of 1st 2nd and 3rd on Victorian yardstick will be awarded for each class with a minimum of 4 entries.

15.4 If less than 4 entries are entered for a class, prizes for that class will be issued at the discretion of the sailing committee.
